Position purpose

The Contracts Inspector for Electrical is responsible for inspecting process electrical systems to ensure they are designed, installed, and commissioned and report all findings to the applicable Unitywater Project Manager or their nominee, in accordance with Unitywater's requirements, to achieve the agreed objectives of Unitywater.

Position accountabilities

Key functions of the role include:

- Work autonomously and independently to conduct the role of Contracts Inspector Electrical for Unitywater. This includes maintaining a log of events and reporting progress onsite, conveying written instructions and advice to and from the Superintendent, the Contractors and the Principals Representative, monitoring activities onsite, reviewing drawings relevant to the Project ITPs / ITCs.
- Assessing, and advising the Superintendent and the Principal's Representative on progress payments, variations, and other claims, as required.
- Review initial Design, IFCs and As-Built engineering drawings, reports, ITPs and plans in relation to water supply and waste infrastructure to ensure statutory requirements are meet and sound engineering and environmental outcomes are achieved.
- Provide specialist and technical support and guidance on legislative requirements, Project scoping, Project design, Project delivery and Project completion to various Unitywater departments where required.
- Perform inspection services and supervise testing of works in a timely manner in accordance with the projects witness or hold points to ensure standards of workmanship comply with the relevant construction and development standards.



- Witness defect inspections or system functionality testing services at the FAT (where applicable) and SAT in accordance with the Projects approved ITPs to ensure workmanship and standards comply with the relevant SEQ Codes, WSAA codes, COPs, Unitywater specifications, Unitywater standard drawings, Australian standards and applicable legislation.
- Conduct quality audits and inspections to ensure construction performance and compliance are in line with Unitywater's quality, safety, environmental standards and legislation.
- Ensure all works are being undertaken in accordance with the Workplace Health & Safety
 Legislation and fulfil workplace health and safety responsibilities in accordance with the Workplace
 Health & Safety policy.
- Ensure all works are being undertaken in accordance with the relevant Environmental Legislation policy.
- Undertake or arrange engineering surveys of as-constructed water supply and waste works, ensuring that surveys are performed accurately, efficiently, and safely and that all survey data is correctly recorded, processed, and presented.
- Ensure that true and accurate "as constructed" information is obtained from Contractors, Consultants and Field Staff.
- Professionally interact with internal and external stakeholders to maintain a positive community relationship during project construction.
- Partake in procedural updates where applicable for continuous improvements to maintain Unitywater's high level of professionalism.
- Meet all HACCP (Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point).
- Meet relevant ISO standard
- Support and role model the WH&S policies, procedures, and practices of Unitywater as amended from time to time.
- Participate in Unitywater safety audits and inspections to demonstrate visible safety leadership and participation.
- Such other relevant duties as required from time to time which would generally fall within the skill and knowledge requirements for this position.
