Class A+ recycled water

- For domestic users in some estates in the South Caboolture and Morayfield area, Class A+ recycled water is supplied via dual reticulation.
- Dual reticulation is when a property has two sets of pipes: one for drinking water and one for recycled water. Recycled water pipes are coloured purple
- Class A+ recycled water can be used for garden irrigation, outdoor wash down, washing down vehicles and cleaning equipment. Please refer to the table on the next page for a comprehensive list of approved uses.

Is recycled water safe?

- When used correctly, recycled water is safe for all approved uses. Appropriate precautions must be considered when using recycled water.
- Unitywater's recycled water is produced and monitored to meet stringent quality guidelines set by the State Government.
- Class A+ recycled water is treated to a very high standard and is suitable for a wide range of uses, as detailed on the following page.

<p>Class A+ recycled water is suitable for the following uses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Gardens✓ Toilet flushing✓ Outdoor hosing and washdown✓ Open space irrigation✓ Irrigation of human food crops✓ Washing animals (except pigs)✓ Stock watering✓ Industrial purposes✓ Water features and fountains	<p>Class A+ recycled water is NOT suitable for the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">✗ Drinking (humans and pigs)✗ Cooking or other kitchen purposes✗ Personal washing, such as baths, showers, bidets and hand basins✗ Washing clothes✗ Indoor household cleaning✗ Filling of swimming pools or spas✗ Recreation activities involving water contact (e.g. children playing under sprinklers)✗ Fill or topping up of residential non-drinking water tanks

Precautions for safe use

- Follow the Dos and Don'ts listed in the table on the previous page.
- Wash your hands with soap and drinking water before eating, drinking or smoking.
- If you have customers, friends or visitors over, let them know of the precautions when using recycled water (i.e. the items on this sheet).
- Always ensure that recycled water fixtures (taps & pipes) are coloured purple and labelled with "recycled water", or "non-potable" or "not for drinking" signs.

First aid measures

- If you accidentally drink recycled water and any symptoms such as vomiting and diarrhoea develop, you should seek medical advice.

Environmental considerations

- Restrict the amount used to avoid ponding of water and minimise runoff into waterways.
- Like our drinking water supplies, recycled water is a precious resource. Please use recycled water wisely.
