1. Policy Statement

Unitywater recognises that the wellbeing of our community and the economic strength and sustainability of our region is dependent on the health of our environment. Unitywater's Corporate Strategic Plan commits us to being environmentally responsible by striving to ensure that our products and services accord with environmental legislation and minimise the impact on the environment.

2. Purpose and Objectives

The purpose of this Policy is to communicate Unitywater's commitment to supporting a sustainable environment within its area of operations.

Unitywater is certified for an Environmental Management System (EMS) that is compliant with legislative obligations and the ISO 14000 family of standards for environmental management.

Unitywater has developed an Environmental Management Plan that outlines some of the key measures taken to look after our local natural environment. The plan includes information on how Unitywater:

- contributes to healthy waterways, beaches and clean air through innovative sewage services
- is striving to use resources efficiently and minimise waste
- adds extra value through projects that provide multiple benefits, to customers, the community and the environment
- manages day-to-day environmental risks through systems and processes.

Unitywater is committed to complying with environmental legislation, regulations, standards and other requirements for all our operations, and:

1. Implementing and continuously improving an effective, environmental management system that is consistent with the certification requirements of *ISO 14001*, and that covers all our operations



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2. Setting clear, measurable targets for managing our environmental risks, ensuring continuous improvement
3. Preventing, reducing and controlling contaminant releases and pollution from our operations, including releases into rivers and ocean
4. Promoting the exchange of environmental programs and initiatives with our internal and external customers
5. Reducing waste generation, carbon emissions and the use of water and energy within our day-to-day operations
6. Implementing best practice environmental management
7. Regularly assessing and reviewing the Environmental Policy and procedures to ensure objectives are being met and to identify barriers and enablers to ongoing effectiveness.

3. Policy Scope/Coverage

This Policy applies to all Unitywater staff, including:

- a. Unitywater employees (both permanent, casual and fixed term contracted employees);
- b. Board members;
- c. Contractors, consultants, volunteers, students, visitors or external labour hire engaged by or associated with Unitywater who are involved in any work for, on behalf of or as agents for Unitywater.

4. Roles and Responsibility

All staff and contractors of Unitywater will be responsible for implementing the intent described above.
